- 1. The Workshops that were conducted with some degree of success in 2009 will be reinstituted this year. The tentative date of commencement will be Thursday 15 April, with sessions held from 10am to 12. The workshops will follow the lines previously established, but with a limit to the number of days spent on each topic.
