## WHAT'S NEW?

Good news for some of our members: we are back on the internet. The Club has purchased a Wi-Fi device which allows wireless connection to the net. We are indebted to the assistance of Meryl Cheetham from Sales in presenting a submission from the Committee to the "owners" (aka the receivers), following advice from Peter Bennett on the matter. The owners came to the party and donated \$150 to the project. In effect, this amount purchases 10 GB over twelve months. The Club purchased the equipment at a special price of \$99. There was some expense in having Peter set up the #1 and #2 computers to be wireless enabled. In future, the Club will pay \$150 (at current prices) for recharge either at the end of 12 months or when the current charge runs out – whichever comes first. It is up and running, but there are some conditions to be observed:

- > The Club has to make a charge on a user-pays basis. Members using the internet will pay \$1 for every half hour or less, as on a notice attached to the desks which house the computers linked up. Details should be entered in the pink folder and money placed in the money box.
- A member using the facility for the first time will need tuition on how to access it and must seek this tuition before attempting to do so. Contact Kevin (133) or Laurie (303) for assistance. Hopefully, no further tuition will be required. The guidelines that are provided should be adhered to rigidly, so bring a notebook. Don't be alarmed, the procedure is really very simple; it becomes necessary because of security concerns. There are some matters which need to be kept confidential; these will be explained.

The Committee will keep a close eye on the usage of the internet to make decisions on the continued operation of the facility, which is available to members only. Present indications are that the user-pay system will not cover the costs involved, but Club funds will contribute to a large degree in using time and memory in the recurring updates needed to keep the computer systems, including our two laptops, in top order.

The next *INFONITE* will be held at 7 pm on Tuesday 24 April, when Bryan Roebuck will present Episode 2 of using bPay. Previously, Bryan had demonstrated the buying potential of bPay and this time will show how to sell.
